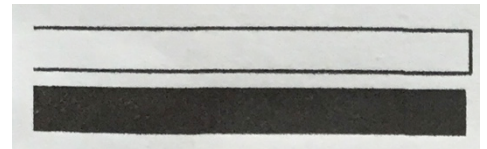
Flying Squares

Finished size 10", your block should measure 10 ½" x 10 ½"

Designed by Tony Haas, Circa 2002. Tony was BOM chair, Guild president, and Designed Imperial Garden, our 2003 Opportunity quilt before he moved to Oregon where he belongs to the Northwestern Quilters.

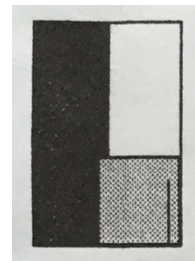
This pattern is ideal for jelly rolls. Note: throughout, all seams are pressed toward the outside of the block.

1. Lay two 2 ½" strips (one very light and one very dark) face-to-face and seam together (¼") along the long side for 26". Cut this into 4-6 ½" pieces and press the seams toward the dark fabric.

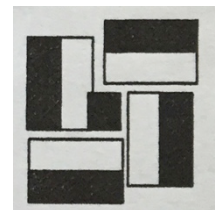


2. Cut one 2 ½" x 2 ½" piece (center) from the dark fabric.

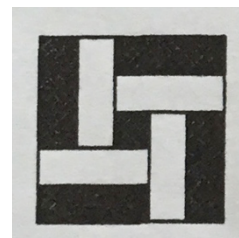
3. Lay the center piece face down onto the bottom end of the light fabric of one of the light-dark pieces (see to the left). Seam ¾" of the way (as shown). It is important to get your block started correctly or your block will "spin" in the opposite direction.



4. Continue working around your block, sewing the light fabric onto the center - light- dark fabric side of the center. The last seam will complete the seam you left unfinished in 3 above. Press.



5. The finished block will look like this.
